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Executive Summary

The University of New Hampshire Survey Center included four questions on its May 2023 Granite State Poll for the New Hampshire Independence Political Action Committee to gauge New Hampshire residents' opinions on the idea of New Hampshire seceding from the United States. One thousand, one hundred and five (1,105) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between May 18 and May 22, 2023. The margin of sampling error is +/- 2.9 percent.

The following figures display survey results, detailed tabular results may be found in Appendix A, and Appendix B contains the survey instrument. Due to rounding, percentages may not add to 100%.

Key Findings

Awareness and Attitudes Towards Secession

Most New Hampshire residents say they don't recall hearing very much or anything at all about the New Hampshire House of Representatives in March 2022 rejecting a proposed constitutional amendent calling for New Hampshire to peaceably declare independence from the United States.


One in five state residents would support holding a vote to determine whether voters in New Hampshire want the state to peaceably declare independence from the United States. A majority of self-described libertarians and about one-third of conservatives and self-identified Republicans support such a vote, while very few progressives or liberals or Democrats support such a vote.

One in six Granite Staters support New Hampshire peaceably seceding from the United States and governing itself as an independent country while three-quarters of state residents oppose such an action. Support for secession is highest among libertarians, Connecticut Valley residents, and 2020 Trump voters, while it is lowest among socialists, liberals, progressives, and Democrats. More than half definitely or probably would want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already part of the union while more than one-quarter say they would definitely or probably not want New Hampshire to join.

Awareness and Attitudes Towards Secession


Only 5% of New Hampshire residents say that they have heard a lot about the N.H. House of Representatives in March 2022 rejecting a proposed constitutional amendment calling for New Hampshire to peaceably declare independence from the United States and govern itself as an independent country. Twenty-three percent say that they heard some about this, 21% heard not very much, 50% did not hear about it at all, and less than 1% don't know or are unsure.


• North Country and Manchester Area residents, MSNBC and CNN viewers, and those with a household income between \$45,000 and \$74,999 are more likely than others to say that they heard a lot or some about the N.H. House of Representatives in March 2022 rejecting a proposed constitutional amendment calling for New Hampshire to peaceably declare independence from the United States and govern itself as an independent country. Those who did not vote in 2020, Connecticut Valley and Central/Lakes Region residents, those with a household income below \$45,000, self-described conservatives, and self-identified Republicans are less likely to have heard this much about this.

Figure 1b: How much heard about NH House 2022 Rejection of Independence Constitutional Amendment - May 2023 - By Demographics




Twenty percent of New Hampshire residents strongly (9%) or somewhat (11%) support the idea of New Hampshire holding a vote to find out whether voters want New Hampshire to peacefully declare independence from the United States. Eight percent are neutral on the question or say it doesn't matter to them, 69% somewhat (9%) or strongly (60%) oppose holding such a vote, and 3% don't know or are unsure.

Self-described libertarians and conservatives, Connecticut Valley residents, those who voted for Trump in 2020, those with
a household income below \$45,000, Joe Rogan listeners, self-identified Republicans, and those aged 35 to 49 are more
likely than others to support New Hampshire holding a vote to find out whether voters want New Hampshire to peacefully
declare independence from the United States. Self-described progressives, liberals, and moderates, MSNBC and CNN
viewers, Central/Lakes Region and Seacoast residents, those who have completed postgraduate work, those who voted for
Biden in 2020 or did not vote, and self-identified Democrats are less likely to support this.


Figure 2b: Support NH vote on peacfully declaring independence from the United States - May 2023 - By Demographics



Sixteen percent of New Hampshire residents strongly (3%) or somewhat (13%) support the idea of New Hampshire peacefully seceding from the United States and governing itself as a separate country. Three percent are neutral on the question or say it doesn't matter to them, 76% strongly (70%) or somewhat (6%) oppose seceding while 5% don't know or are unsure.


Among those who support a vote on the issue (N=220), 70% support New Hampshire peacefully seceding from the United States, while among those who oppose a vote on the issue (N=760), nearly all (>99%) oppose New Hampshire peacefully seceding from the United States.

Figure 3a: Would you support or oppose New Hampshire peacefully seceding from the United States and governing itself as a separate country? - May 2023




• Self-described libertarians, Connecticut Valley residents, those who voted for Trump in 2020, self-identified Republicans, and those with a household income between \$75,000 and \$99,999 are more likely than others to support New Hampshire peacefully seceding from the United States and governing itself as a separate country. Self-described socialists, liberals, progressives, and moderates, NHPR listeners, self-identified Democrats, those who voted for Biden in 2020 or did not vote, Seacoast and Central/Lakes Region residents, MSNBC viewers, and those who have completed postgraduate work are less likely to support this.

Figure 3b: Support New Hampshire peacefully seceding the United States - May 2023 - By Demographics




Fifty-seven percent of New Hampshire residents definitely (39%) or probably (18%) would want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already a member of the union. Twenty-eight percent probably (18%) or definitely (10%) would not want New Hampshire to join while 15% are unsure.

• Joe Rogan and NHPR listeners, self-described progressives, liberals, and moderates, self-identified Democrats, MSNBC and CNN viewers, those who voted for Biden in 2020, those with a household income between \$100,000 and \$149,999, those who attended technical school or have some college education, and Seacoast residents are more likely than others to definitely or probably want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already a member of the union. Self-described liberatarians and socialists, those who voted for Trump in 2020 or did not vote, those with a household income below \$45,000 or between \$75,000 and \$99,999, Connecticut Valley residents, self-identified Independents and Republicans, and those with a high school education or less are less likely to say they would definitely or probably want New Hampshire to join.


Figure 4b: Think NH should join United States if not already a member - May 2023 - By Demographics Definitely or Probably



May 2023

Fifty-three percent of New Hampshire residents say that they oppose secession and would want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already a part of the union. Nine percent oppose secession but say they would not want New Hampshire to join the United States, 1% support secession but would want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already a member, 15% support secession and would not want New Hampshire to join the United States if it were not already a member, and 22% gave another combination of responses.

Technical Report

How the Sample Was Selected

The May 2023 Granite State Poll survey was a web-based survey of Granite State Panel members who are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire. The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Respondents to the Granite State Poll were asked if they wished to participate in further research and asked to provide an email address. Those who agreed and provided an email address were added to the panel. Panel members were also recruited by texting a random sample of cellular telephones in the state and inviting the recipient to take a short survey. At the conclusion of the survey, recipients were asked if they would like to join the panel and provide an email address. Respondents under the age of 18, non-New Hampshire residents, and seasonal residents who are not registered to vote in New Hampshire were excluded from this survey and did not receive an invitation to join the panel. For each survey which they complete, panel members are entered into quarterly drawings to earn rewards, such as gift certificates from statewide and internet companies.

When Data Was Collected

An invitation email was sent to Granite State Panel members on May 19th, 2023. Two email reminders were sent to non-responders and the survey was completely closed on the morning of May 22nd. One thousand, one hundred and five (1,105) Granite State Panel members completed the survey. The response rate for the May 2023 Granite State Poll is 28%.

Weighting of Data

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.

Sampling Error

The Granite State Poll, like all surveys, is subject to sampling error due to the fact that all residents in the area were not interviewed. For those questions asked of five hundred (500) or so respondents, the error is +/-4.4%. For those questions where fewer than 500 persons responded, the sampling error can be calculated as follows:

Sampling Error =
$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{P(1-P)}{N}}$$

Where P is the percentage of responses in the answer category being evaluated and N is the total number of persons answering the particular question.

For example, suppose you had the following distribution of answers to the question, "Should the state spend more money on road repair even if that means higher taxes?" Assume 1,000 respondents answered the question as follows:

YES	47%
NO	48%
DON'T KNOW	5%

The sampling error for the "YES" percentage of 47% would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{47(53)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

for the "NO" percentage of 48% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{48(52)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

and for the "DON'T KNOW" percentage of 5% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{5(95)}{1000}} = \pm 1.4\%$$

In this case we would expect the true population figures to be within the following ranges:

YES	43.9% - 50.1% (i.e., 47% ±3.1%)
NO	44.9% - 51.1% (i.e., 48% ±3.1%)
DON'T KNOW	3.6% - 6.4% (i.e., 5% ±1.4%)

The margin of sampling error for the May 2023 Granite State Poll is +/-2.9 percent.

Design Effect

These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.6%.
